Bertha		Protector of orphans, pregnant women, the unborn, and lost souls
Brynhilde		Tyz's Shieldmaiden
Donar	Thunor	Donar is a god of thunder, storms and farmers.
Eostre	Ostara	Goddess of fertility and the sun
Fenrir		The destroyer - a monster in the shape of a wolf.
Frea	Frija	Goddess of midwifery and childbirth
Freyr		God of love and kingship
Hertha	Nerthas	Hertha is the goddess of the Earth
Ing		Ancestor of the gods
Njord		Patron of shipbuilding, god of the sea, brother to Hertha
Nornir	Norns	The three fates.
Rind		A giantess
The Alcis		Twin daughters of Tyz, who carry the sun across the ske each day.
Tyz	Tiwaz, Irmin, Seaxneat	Chief of the pantheon, Tyz is primarily a war god, but is also the god of the sky. Prisoners taken in war are sacrificed to Tyz
Wods	Wotan	God of wind
The Shining Citadel	Valhall, Valhalla	Tyz's home, and the place where the worthy go to live when they fall in battle.
Tyzsul	Irminsul	The rod or pillar which symbolically connects heaven(Hamon) and earth - one is found in each king's village. It's continued good condition is symbolic of state of the king's rule.
Hamon		Heaven - the roof of the world. Where souls who deserve passage into neither the Shining Citadel nor Hel go after death.
(Festivals)		Festivals are held throughout the year, irregularly, usually after some blessing is perceived to have come from the gods (victory in battle, childbirth, a good harvest, etc) or to implore the gods for such a blessing. An exception is Gule, the new year's feast
(Priestly duties)		Primarily, the priests tend to shrines to the gods, and are responsible for reading omens, performing sacrifices, if necessary, to so. They are also the primary keepers of Runic knowledge.
Runes		Eldar Futhark runes (http://upload.wikimedia.org/wikipedia/en/0/00/Old_Futhark_Runic_alphabet.png) form the basis of the system of writing used at the time around here. Each has a symboloc meaning in addition to its phonetic meaning, the interpretation of whih take training to master.
